

Students interested in Clinical and Counseling Psychology may choose to pursue a minor either to supplement the work in their majors or to fulfill the requirements for a related area within their majors. The minor in Clinical and Counseling Psychology requires students to complete five three-credit courses totaling 15 credits.
